-Read a book at bedtime

-State the behavior that you want to see, not the one that you do not

-Play games when at necessary appointment/errands to keep child calm and engaged

Why does PBIS work?

-Lets the child know that they are safe -Awareness of child's needs and interests --Connecting Home and School expectations -Involve families -Teach social skills -Build strong relationships between Families and School Staff -Establish consistent routines -Provide activities based on child's activity and skill level -Offers choices -Model appropriate social skills and positive behavior

PBIS creates a more positive school experience.

Three "Bee" Rules: Be Safe, Be Kind, Be Responsible

Teaches positive behavior at home, school and the community.

Children are recognized for positive behavior.

-Help children express emotions in a healthy way -Teach emotional regulation, friendship and problem-solving skills
